ICDL Candidate FAQs

What is ICDL Syllabus Version 4.0 (SV4)?

SV4 is an update to Syllabus Version 3.0 –updated to ensure that the ICDL certification program continues to be relevant with ongoing advances and new developments of technologies.

For how much longer will syllabus version 3.0 testing be available?

Syllabus version 3.0 will be available for six months from the official launch date of syllabus version 4.0 i.e. up to 31 December 2004.

Will this affect my current ICDL modules completed under syllabus version 3.0? I have not completed all seven modules yet.

Syllabus version 3.0 modules that have been completed are valid, as long as the oldest module completed does not exceed three years, enabling you to proceed with testing for your remaining modules under syllabus version 4.0.

Can I take ICDL module tests in both 'manual' and 'automated' testing methods?

Yes, candidates can mix both 'manual' and 'automated' testing methods without penalty.

When will syllabus version 4.0 be available?

Syllabus version 4.0 will be phased into all Test Centres in Australia and Papua New Guinea over a six month period, commencing on 1 July 2004. Availability of syllabus version 4.0 testing will be dependent on your local Test Centre.

Can I take my ICDL tests at another Test Centre?

Yes. Your ICDL Skills Card is recognised not only throughout Australian Test Centres but is transportable around the world. Candidates are free to take ICDL tests at any accredited ICDL Test Centre worldwide.
