



STAFF AND STUDENTS AT KORMILDA COLLEGE BENEFIT FROM THE ICDL

The ICDL program has proved to be the perfect fit for staff and students at Darwin's Kormilda College.

Introduced as a resource for academic staff eight months ago, the success of the program is such that Kormilda is now offering the ICDL to its students and is running night classes for staff and external applicants.

Nearly twenty percent of staff have taken advantage of this program to raise their computing skills to a level that is recognised internationally. Five staff have already achieved their ICDL.

Kormilda College is also a member of the International Baccalaureate (IB) Organisation. The ICDL, with its international benchmarking, complements the global perspective of this IB World School.

The student population at Kormilda is unique within Australia. About one third of all students are indigenous boarders and most of those come from remote Aboriginal communities, while two-thirds of the school population are day students from the Darwin and Greater Darwin areas. The individual needs of students are broad and the curriculum is extensive in order to accommodate such diverse requirements.

The ICDL program is a welcome resource that is clearly benefiting a wide range of staff and students at Kormilda. This year, the ICDL program will enjoy a great uptake by staff and by students from Year 10.
